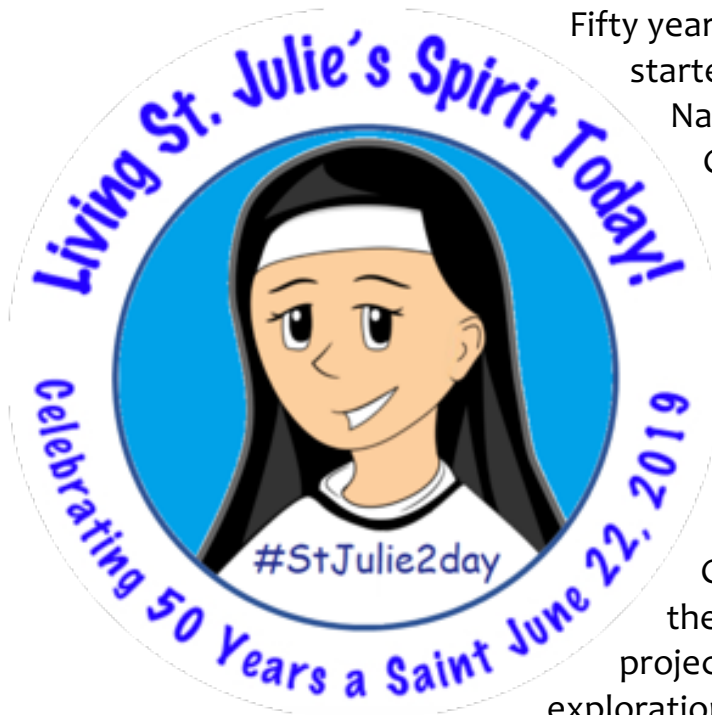


Look who's turning 50!



Fifty years ago, Julie Billiart, the woman who started the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur, was declared a Saint by the Catholic Church. The qualities in her life that moved the Church to declare her a Saint are as important today as they were in the beginning of the 1800s when Julie lived and in the late 1960s when she was canonized.
